What You Can Do to Clean the Air

According to The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) each day you can have an important role in the cleanliness of the air you breath. Any time you use energy – whether it's gasoline, diesel, electricity or wood -- you contribute to air pollution in your community and communities downwind.

Saving energy reduces pollution – and it can save you money! You can help reduce pollution by following these guidelines. These recommendations are especially important when the air is expected to be unhealthy:

- Conserve electricity and set your air conditioner at a higher temperature.
- Choose a cleaner commute—share a ride to work by vanpooling/carpooling or using public transportation, i.e. the Franklin Trolleys or Nashville's MTA. Combine errands and reduce trips.
- Bicycle or walk to errands when possible.
- Defer use of gasoline-powered lawn and garden equipment for later in the day, or for days when the air quality is better.
- Refuel cars and trucks after dusk.
- Limit engine idling.
- Get regular engine tune ups and car maintenance checks (especially for the spark plugs).
- Avoid spilling gas and don't "top off" the tank. Replace gas tank cap tightly.
- Properly dispose of household paints, solvents and pesticides. Store these materials in airtight containers.
- Paint with a brush, not a sprayer.
- Buy low VOC paints for indoor and outdoor painting jobs.

You can help prevent or reduce unhealthy levels of particulate matter pollution with these actions:

- Reduce or eliminate fireplace and wood stove use.
- Avoid using gas-powered lawn and garden equipment.
- Avoid burning leaves, trash and other materials.
- Use household, workshop, and garden chemicals in ways that keep evaporation to a minimum, or try to delay using them when poor air quality is forecast.
- Replace your car's air filter and oil regularly

Daily Air Quality Reports on the Air

WAKM AM950 broadcasts the Environmental Report™ each day featuring the Air Quality Index, the Air Quality forecast, the UV index, and Heat/Cold index. In case of an Air Alert Day, WAKM AM950 broadcasts the information hourly until the situation eases.
